"The old saying 'Live and Let live' seems so commonplace, it is easy to overlook its value. Of course, one reason it has been said over and over for years is that it has proved beneficial in so many ways...To begin to put the concept of 'Live and Let Live' into practice, we must face this fact: There *are* people in A.A, and everywhere else, who sometimes say things we disagree with, or do things we don't like...For that matter, we'll meet some people in AA or elsewhere who won't be exactly crazy about us, either...Learning to live with differences is essential to our comfort...However offensive or distasteful it may seem to us, it is certainly *not* worth drinking about. Our own recovery is too important.

As time goes on, we find we are not afraid simply to walk away from people who irritate us, instead of meekly letting them get under our skin, or instead of trying to straighten them out just so they will suit us better. We never let ourselves get so resentful toward someone else that we allow that person to control our lives—especially to the extent of causing us to drink. We have found we have no desire to let any other person run, or ruin, our lives...When we have worked out ways to enjoy *our own* living fully, then we are content to let other people live any way they want." always what they seem to be.
